The Hillsborough Veterans Court is a problem solving court that is set up to offer treatment rather than the incarceration for veterans whose mental health appears to have contributed to their arrest. Hillsborough County is home to nearly 100,000 veterans. The 13th Judicial Circuit seeks to provide assistance to eligible participants through a diversion away from the traditional criminal justice system with support and rehabilitation. That rehabilitation includes treatment, education, vocational programs, community referrals and transportation.

11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds requested will assist the Hillsborough Clerk of Courts fund case management services for the Hillsborough County Veterans Court.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These funds will assist with case management with a dedicated employee for that role. Additional staff will assist in coordinating the treatment court. Additional funding is to be used for testing and risk assessment to make sure veterans are being served and compliance is determined.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The Veterans Treatment Court in Hillsborough County will be supplemented by funding in order to serve more Veterans - as the Court currently receives no state funding. The funding will allow more Veterans to access rehabilitation rather than incararation. The Veteran population of Hillsborough County is the largest in the State.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Veterans residing in Hillsborough County, Florida with eligible charges (ordinance violations, misdemeanor offenses other than DUI, and nonviolent third degree felony offenses). Generally, veterans treatment court helps treat veterans with honor and respect and is modeled after principles of therapeutic jurisprudence.



e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

With such a large population of Veterans in Hillsborough County (nearly 100,000), the program that already exists will be able to streamline operations to assist more citizens in need. Numerous studies have show that treatment is far more cost effective than incarceration, saving State and local funding. The methodology (which would be assisted by dedicated staff paid through the allocation) would include tracking the success of the program. Keeping track of the number of participants who successfully complete the program, assessing employment status of veterans in the program, and ability to manage their basic needs. Additionally, avoidance of further law enforcement incidents is another parameter to be considered.
