The intent of this request is to install permanently mounted emergency by-pass pumps at 6 locations throughout the City. The pumps will be powered by a natural gas or diesel engine and will be operated by an independent set of float controls. The systems will be completely stand alone to the most comprehensive redundancies possible. These redundancies will minimize the periods the amount of time that systems are inoperable as they were during and immediately following Hurricane Michael. The proposed stations to be upgraded are: Carolina Street, Circle Drive, County Jail, Key Street, Virginia Street and Wal-Mart.

The goal of this project is to mitigate future interruptions in the wastewater system due to emergencies or unforeseen complications.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The City currently does not have any emergency ready facilities at their lift stations. These by-pass pumps will provide the necessary component to keep the lift stations running during a time of emergency or unforeseen complications.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

By installing these by-pass pumps in the lift stations, during a time of emergency, the City's wastewater system can run uninterrupted. Therefore, the citizens can continue to have access to City utility services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served is the residents within the collection basin served by each of the proposed lift stations. This population is estimated at 7,200 citizens.

The expected outcome of this project would be to provide the citizens of Quincy with a utility system that will have the capabilities of running independently during emergency situations or unforeseen complications.
