#### 11. Program Performance:

#### a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funding will be used to provide retention pay bonuses for direct care staff of providers contracted with the Department of Juvenile Justice. Positions affected by this request work directly with children under the care, control, and custody of the Department, such as Child Care Worker I, Child Care Worker II, Child Care Worker Supervisor, Case Manager, Senior Case Manager, and Case Manager Supervisor.

#### b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Current contracted employees working directly with children under the Departments care, control, and custody will receive across the board retention pay bonus increases. This proposal addresses the high turnover rate and offers a competitive wage to retain staff.

#### c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

While delinquency is at a 40 plus year low in our state over 60,000 children a year are still arrested and referred to the Department of Juvenile Justice for community based diversion, supervision, and residential care. The workforce providing services to these children are a combination of state and contracted employees. Each contracted direct service employee affected by this request must meet minimum statutory hiring requirements and undergo over 100 hours of training before working directly with a child. The concentrated level of acuity of the children receiving care in the community and in residential settings is much higher today than ever before. The system requires that we continue to hire and most importantly retain skilled workers to provide direct care to the children in Florida's juvenile justice system's broad continuum of services from CINS/FINS group home settings to deep end secure residential care.

In FY 2016-17 DJJ received 64,824 delinquency referrals. It is estimated that approximately 50,000 children will receive delinquency rehabilitation and intervention services by the contracted service providers benefiting from this request.
