- 1. Title of Project: Affordable Housing for Veterans

- 4. Project/Program Description:

This project will provide permanent, affordable housing for Veterans. Phase I will include 22, 1 bedroom and 3, 2 bedrooms units. One important benefit for Veterans is that Veterans living with Veterans can have a positive influence in reducing the daily suicide rate.

In addition, there will be a multi-function Community Center (6,000 sq. ft.) containing a full kitchen and library/computer center. Also, the center will be able to serve as a disaster/distribution point and house up to 150 individuals for a short term in event of a declared disaster by the Governor. There will be showers and restroom facilities. Normal use will include meeting rooms for American Legion Post 84 Family and other non-profit Veteran Service Organizations. The hall (4,000 sq. ft.) can be rented out for private and public functions.
