The City of North Lauderdale's primary water management system consists of approximately 132.9 surface acres of waterways and lakes. This includes approximately 26 canals throughout the City. Following intense rain events the City experiences extensive flooding to City roadways and residential property, mostly due to the fact that our canals are saturated and the excess water has nowhere to drain. The flooding causes damages to residential property and transportation congestion or roadblocks that directly impact the City's population. The project scope of work would be to dredge a selected number of canals throughout the City to increase capacity for stormwater.

The specific purpose of the funds is to dredge a selected number of canals throughout the City to increase capacity for stormwater runoff, thus alleviating flooding issues to roadways and damages to residential property throughout the City.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Create more retention volume in the canals by dredging of system.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Significant decrease to flood damages to citizen's property and significant reduction to transportation congestion and roadblocks due to flooding that directly impacts the commute of of the City's population and other neighboring municipalities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will directly impact the schools, City parks, emergency services, and residents of the community.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The outcome will be a decrease in documented flooding events; including flood damages to residents' property and significant reduction in transportation congestion and roadblocks caused by flooded roadways. The tracking of the outcome will be measured by the reduced number of complaints and insurance claims caused by flooding incidents.
