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11. Program Performance

	a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?
	Mathematical thinking, including the ability to reason, problem-solve and think critically, is essential for success in school and the modern workforce. Algebra Nation is proven to build students' core mathematical knowledge and skills, as demonstrated by multiple studies. As Florida continues to expand students' options of schools to best meet their needs, Algebra Nation also desires to expand its platform to offer targeted support in middle grade math, pre-algebra, algebra 1, geometry, and algebra 2 to students and teachers in the state, including those in private, charter, and home school settings. With the requested funding, Algebra Nation will be able to offer its online tools and resources, including engaging instructional videos, practice tool with real-time feedback, after-hours online homework help and tutoring, and private teacher area filled with dozens of lesson and activities.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	Funding will support costs associated with providing digital platform access to all public, private, charter, and home school students and teachers in Florida for 6th, 7th, 8th, algebra 1, geometry, and algebra 2 content, resources, and tools. In addition, Algebra Nation will serve as a leading support in transitioning to the new state standards through targeted professional development for teachers and online resources with content and exemplar pedagogical strategies for standard implementation.
C.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Florida's students and teachers, regardless of school, will benefit from free, around-the-clock access to a comprehensive suite of online teaching and learning supports built to improve student understanding and mastery of critical mathematics content. This includes hundreds of engaging instructional videos led by master teachers, thousands of practice questions to track progress with real-time feedback, and live support from experts and peers. In addition, Algebra Nation will incorporate the new mathematics standards in the content and offer targeted professional development to assist middle and high school teachers in making the transition as seamlessly as possible so that focus can be given to empowering students to be successful in mathematics.
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	The target population is 6-12 grade students and teachers from public, private, charter, and home school settings across all 67 Florida counties. This equates to approximately 500,000 students and 30,000 teachers in Florida.
e.	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	Multiple studies have demonstrated Algebra Nation's impact on student achievement in Algebra 1. A recent study shows a 26-point higher average passing rate of the Algebra 1 FSA in public schools that frequently used Algebra Nation (Qui, Y., 2018). Additional studies are planned to analyze the impact of the Algebra Nation platform on student achievement in other courses.
