4. **Project/Program Description**

The City of Umatilla owns and operates an aging wastewater treatment plant that does not meet federal reliability requirements. The plant was built in the 1960's and is past its useful life. This project would allow the City of Umatilla to construct a wastewater interconnect (pipeline, pump, and required lift stations) with the City of Eustis. Wastewater generated in the City of Umatilla would be pumped to the City of Eustis for treatment through this interconnect. The Umatilla Wastewater Treatment Plant would be decommissioned and demolished. This project partnering with the City of Eustis would save taxpayers over \$6 million vs. building a new wastewater treatment plant.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The City of Umatilla owns and operates an aging wastewater treatment plant that does not meet federal reliability requirements. This project would allow the City of Umatilla to construct a wastewater interconnect (pipeline, pump, and lift stations) with the City of Eustis. Wastewater generated in the City of Umatilla would be pumped to the City of Eustis for treatment through this interconnect. The Umatilla Wastewater Treatment Plant would be decommissioned and demolished. This project via the partnership with with the City of Eustis would save taxpayers over \$6 million vs. building a new wastewater treatment plant.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of a wastewater interconnect between the Cities of Umatilla and Eustis to allow wastewater generated in Umatilla to be pumped to the City of Eustis for treatment and the decommissioning of the aging Umatilla Wastewater Treatment Plant.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Wastewater generated in the City of Umatilla would continue to be treated to standards required by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is the City of Umatilla, approximately 4,200 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Wastewater effluent permit limits would continue to be met. Discharge monitoring reports submitted to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection would provide verification.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Typical liquidated damages penalties for the contractor constructing the project would be in the range of \$500 to \$1,000 per day.
