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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Broward College seeks to improve security at its campuses and centers. Broward College's campuses and centers cover over 400 acres in Broward County with more than 240 buildings. Additionally, Broward College seeks to train administration and faculty to properly assess behavioral and mental health concerns as they occur in order to better ensure that the Broward College environment is safe for all.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Broward College seeks to improve its security at each of its campuses and centers by ensuring that video surveillance covers more physical area, that door access and locks are centrally controlled, and that its information technology infrastructure and software that support the same are up to date.

Furthermore, Broward College seeks to be proactive in addressing student mental health concerns that have the potential to create security issues. To that end Broward College seeks to train both administration and faculty to address mental health concerns with students on the spot. c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens will benefit from (1) improved security at Broward College's campuses and centers, and (2) improved responses to individuals with behavioral issues as they are observed, also contributing to improved security at our campuses and centers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Broward College has over 64,000 students, and continues to see significant growth in the number of high school students at our campuses and centers due to the popularity of dual enrollment, our collegiate high school, and our technical education programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefit of the project is improved security for students in multiple forms. Success can be measured by the increased number of building entrances and exits that are controlled by access panels and the increased number of acres and buildings covered by video surveillance. Additionally, the training of our administration and faculty should result in fewer security incidents at Broward College.

Should penalties be included, additional reporting requirements regarding security incidents could be considered.
