4. **Project/Program Description**

The Ethical Leader Institute will offer three new degree programs - a bachelor's, master's and doctorate in ethical leadership that will be available in Spring 2020. The Institute will leverage St. Thomas University's ethics-centered identity and incorporate these values into a curriculum that works to develop student's understanding of leadership, instill business competencies such as technical literacy and business management and develop essential soft skills such as critical thinking and communications.

The Institute will engage local business leaders, corporate partners and government entities for joint programming; conduct project based research surrounding ethics and leadership; and offer targeted internships for students as well as develop industry specific certificates for working adults.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

These funds will be used to assist in launching the Ethical Leadership Institute. The goal of the Institute is to provide batchelor's, master's and doctorate degrees to first generation colleges students as well as entry level professionals that prepare them to be ethical leaders and make value-based decisions while learning business competencies, technical literacy and communications skills. These degrees address the values crisis in today's business and government sectors.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Student education, degree attainments, certificate completion and assistance with job placement in the fields of government and business.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Student education, degree attainments, certificate completion and assistance with job placement in the fields of government and business.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

First generation college students and entry-level professionals who want to lead ethically in the areas of business and government and have a positive impact on their communities. As an ongoing project, we will serve 70 students each year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The graduates (batchelor's, master's and doctorate) of the Ethical Leadership Institute will obtain professional positions in business and government. These graduates will provide value-based leadership in their positions that will benefit their communities civic and business environments. Outcome measures will include tracking program alumni career advancement and number of graduates.
