### 4. **Project/Program Description**

The Florida African American Heritage Preservation Network (FAAHPN) is a consortium and professional association of thirty-two (32) African American Museums from Pensacola to Miami organized in 1997. The FAAHPN provides direct grants to small and median size museums that are engaged in historical and cultural programs, projects, events, and research that help to bring diversity and document, preserve, and promote the rich history of Florida. The funds that are requested, and have been received from the legislature since 2009, support technology upgrades, internships, exhibit curatorial and collection care and management, heritage education programs, tourism activities, and provides oversight and accountability of the funds. Approval of these funds will enable these museums to sustain and continue serving their communities and help to actualize Florida historical and cultural preservation initiatives.

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#### 11. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The overall purpose or goal is to further enhance and promote Florida as a destination through heritage education, tourism initiatives, and revitalization of the communities by serving as a direct resource to museums and historical sites across the state of Florida.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Technology and equipment acquisitions, content and exhibit development, preservation of documents and artifacts, internships, field sessions and conferences for professional development, marketing, traveling exhibits, and living history presentations.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Tourism ready venues to visit and appreciate historical communities while learning of those who contributed to the development of that history; the existence of centers to visit and conduct research and enhance skills in historic preservation; places to archive personal collections and venues to host cultural events, and jobs, internship, and volunteer opportunities in a museum.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served by this project are the local communities, state institutions, and organizations seeking and needing historical information and services as well as the tourists and visitors to those institutions. FAAHPN expects to serve thousands of individuals across the state of Florida as well as the entire country as visitors come from many different places to seek historical research.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

While FAAHPN expects many benefits from this project, specifically, it is expected to enrich the cultural experience which is demonstrated through audience and production data from the site visits, exhibits, and events. The quality of education will be improved through heritage lessons and programs where surveys are given to participants to monitor the increase in cultural awareness. FAAHPN will improve economic activity through increased business spending which is shown in third party conducted surveys, invoices, and financial reports. Increased tourism is demonstrated through the number of tours conducted and visitations. Lastly, FAAHPN creates job opportunities and improves an individual's economic self sufficiency by creating and retaining jobs by providing salaries documented by human resource records and reports.

### f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The FAAHPN has never incurred penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures of the Florida Department of State.
