4. **Project/Program Description**

Tech Sassy Girlz (TSG) is the signature program of Collegiate Pathways, Inc., a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization based in Orlando, FL. Our mission is to empower middle and high school girls to pursue science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) fields through college preparation, career readiness, mentoring and entrepreneurship.

Tech Sassy Girlz is an open access, self-select, out-of-school program for girls in middle and high school. It is a project-based program designed to increase the pipeline of under-represented girls in STEM-related fields. Year long programming is delivered to students in informal learning environments that provide hands on experience for students to gain skills-based STEM experience.

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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The program goal is to create educational opportunities by generating awareness of STEM education and careers for low-income, first generation underrepresented girls in middle and high school. Participants in the Tech Sassy Girlz program gain foundational skills to pursue an internship, degree and/or career in STEM.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Students in the Tech Sassy Girlz program gain foundational skills to pursue a degree and/or career in STEM. Our STEM workshops focus on building the girls' technological skills through hands-on activities focusing on software applications, careers in technology, communication skills, and career readiness.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Tech Sassy Girlz delivers innovative programs for girls to gain 21st century technical skills. Services include engaging students in STEM-based paid internships, mentoring opportunities, and hands-on activities through our afterschool programs, hackathons, summer camps, and annual conference.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is underrepresented middle and high school girls. We expect to serve 300 - 500 students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcomes of this project are that the girls will (1) increase their interest and knowledge in technology, (2) increased likelihood of post-secondary degree/certification completion in tech related fields, (3) develop workforce readiness skills develop and increase awareness of and interest in technology-related careers. The program will be evaluated by the following measures: number of program youth served, contact hours, number of youth completing program requirements, number of youth who increase their awareness of STEM professions and careers, and indicate a desire to attend college and pursue a STEM major.
