To purchase the land and building for Young Women's Preparatory Academy, a high-performing school that serves mainly minority students who qualify for free or reduced-price lunch. This would create a significant operations cost-savings over time for Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS). The following entities have approved the sale of the Section 16 land parcel and subsequent use of these funds to purchase said school: The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, Board of County Commissioners, Miami-Dade County, Florida, South Florida Water Management District, Acquisition and Restoration Council (ARC), Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund. The closing of the sale is contingent upon the Section 16 land sale proceeds being used to purchase the school. The requested funding should be contingent upon the closing of the Section 16 land sale proceeds into the State School Trust Fund.
