The City of Sunny Isles Beach will construct a pedestrian bridge across Collins Avenue at 174th Street that will serve three main purposes: provide for much needed pedestrian safety on the only thoroughfare through the City, alleviate traffic congestion by eliminating the street level pedestrian crossing, and create an elevated park setting with permanent seating and space for performing and visual arts in a high-density urban environment.

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11. Program Performance

- a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose of this bridge is to achieve one of the goals in the city's 2016 Transportation Master Plan to make Sunny Isles Beach a more pedestrian friendly urban environment and to create open space for the general public as well as the local artist population. Funds will be used for construction of this bridge.

- b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of bridge.

- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Safe pedestrian access across Collins Avenue, with the public beach on the east side and residential and commercial properties on the west, alleviation of traffic congestion caused by street level pedestrian crosswalk; and an additional open park space that will be elevated and will be used for promoting both visual and performing art (artists will be able to draw, paint, perform, etc. in this space).

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The general public and the local artist population. The bridge will be open to the public. Currently, hundreds of pedestrians cross Collins Avenue at this intersection on a daily basis to access the city's only oceanfront park and the beach on the east side of Collins Avenue, as well as the commercial and residential properties on the west side of Collins Avenue.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefit is to provide pedestrians with a safer way to cross the highly congested Collins Avenue at the busiest intersection in the city, Collins Avenue at 174th Street, and to create a place-making space that will be a passive bridge for access to the beach and nearby commercial and residential properties, as well as provide an active park setting with ocean views and space to observe performing art and visual art being created. Outcome will be measured by monitoring bridge usage and number of art-centric events scheduled on the bridge.

- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Non-issuance of state legislature appropriated funds.
