4. **Project/Program Description**

Liberty County is seeking funding to install drive-by meters in Hosford and make improvements to their Hosford Well #3 operations. The County only has 3 staff members in the water department to cover the entire County. Reading each meter is time consuming and prevents staff from being able to perform other necessary maintenance on the County's system. With this system, the County will be able to maintain the system more efficiently and help to quickly identify water leaks. The County was not able to read the meters for over 3 months following Hurricane Michael due to the debris covering the meters, costing the County almost \$100,000 in revenue. The County also wishes to enclose the building that shelters the Hosford Well #3 equipment, along with other minor upgrades.

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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

It is anticipated that the installation of drive-by meters in this project will reduce staff time, providing a more economical benefit to the County. The meters will also help get a more accurate reading and quickly detect any water leaks. To enclose the building will also preserve the equipment and help maintain continuous operations.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The requested funds, if awarded, will be used for the installation of the new water meters for all current customers in the Hosford/Telogia area connected to the County's water system along with the installation of the computer program that is necessary for the water department to read the meters. It will also be used to enclose the Hosford Well #3 building and construct/install minor upgrades.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The citizens that are benefited from these improvements are expected to be able to have any water leaks and spikes in water usage detected much quicker because the program will be able to track the usages more efficiently than the practice currently used.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

There is approximately 500 customers of the County's Hosford/Telogia water system that will be served by these improvements.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The County will benefit from the receipt of these funds by allowing the County to detect water leaks quickly, and reduce staff time for an economic benefit. The County can monitor employee timesheets to determine the efficiency of the upgraded operations.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The Auditor General conducts audits for both City and State agencies.


Liberty County owns and operates the Hosford Water System, which is receiving the proposed improvements.
