•	Program Performance
а.	What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?  Replacement of Water Main- 72,000 linear feet of galvanized pipe, including service connections and relocation of meters to the front of homes. The purpose of this project is to protect the health and safety of residents & visitors through the replacement of deteriorating pipes that will improve water quality and allow for additional fire hydrant connections. It will also increase level of water service to residents.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	Removal approximately 72,000 LF of deteriorated 2" galvanized water main and replacement installation of the same amount of 8" PVC water main, inclusive of service connections to relocate service to the front of residences.
c.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Residents in the Southeast section of the City have communicated to the City complaints regarding tinted water, low water pressure flow and consistent breaks from the aging water structure. This project will improved water quality, increase level of service, and enhanced public safety.
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	Residents, businesses and visitors in the City of Pembroke Pines (est. population of over 171,000) and surrounding areas will benefit from improved water quality, increased level of service, and enhanced public safety.

	Benefit: Improved water quality and level of service. Measurement: Feedback from community; reduction of complaints.
