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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Inner cities throughout the state of Florida and the US have rich cultural histories that have been obscured and neglected by historians. The ECHO Program will educate 200 financially and culturally disadvantaged youth during the summer of 2020 and after school hours during the academic year regarding the history of Orlando's inner city. ECHO will familiarize them with sites listed in the Negro Motorists Green Book, a directory that identified places that welcomed African Americans during racial segregation and was the subject of the Best Picture Academy Award winning movie, The Green Book. The ECHO program will combat negative stereotypes regarding inner city residents and motivate youth to achieve. ECHO participants will develop high self-esteem, be motivated to do well in school, and connect with caring adult mentors through the weekly sessions.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Youth will receive instruction on an important historic district in their community and expand their knowledge regarding the achievements of individuals from backgrounds similar to theirs who made tremendous contributions to society. PAST, Inc., will provide heritage education to ECHO participants through one on one and computer assisted instruction as well as visits to historically significant sites. ECHO staff will schedule monthly presentations by community professionals who grew up in the inner city and can serve as role models for the youth. Professionals involved in the ECHO program will share information with students regarding career opportunities in various fields including the humanities.

c.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?				
	The ECHO program will increase verbal communication, writing, and computer skills of participants. Activities will involve teamwork and promote collaborative effort to achieve a common purpose. ECHO participants will serve as community ambassadors.				

Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes students in the central Orlando area in middle and high school.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Through interaction with community role models, participants will set life and professional goals, survey career opportunities, and research occupational requirements. The ECHO program will serve to prevent drug and gang activity and juvenile crime.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

A clawback of funds could be considered for failure to meet deliverable or performance measures.
