a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The population growth in the north Pinellas, Pasco, and Hillsborough Counties has been increasing at a very rapid rate. Because of this growth, industry is also on the rise and with the increase in industry comes the need for a well-trained workforce. The SPC Tarpon Springs campus is in a well-positioned location to align with Community and Industry needs. The creation of an Industrial Workforce Incubator on campus would allow for SPC/Tarpon to meet the growing needs of our community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The 2 tier Industrial Workforce Incubator will be designed to serve industry, students (of all generations), and the community creating partnerships with business and SPC:

- 1) The Industrial Lab section will focus on workforce training for high wage jobs in the tri-north county area. The focus being on Bio-Medical/Engineering/ Machining/ Manufacturing/Technological training to support high wage jobs in Florida.
- 2) The Business Incubator section designed as a co-working space geared to support local businesses/entrepreneurship and be supported by a board of current businesses and industry leaders.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Coordinators will work with the college to help screen and assess students' jobs, training, and future needs and develop individualized career plans. They (along with SPC Advisors) will actively engage students in individual and group workforce sessions. The Coordinators will also help support industry and community needs by being stewards and gate keeper of the lab space. Working to increase awareness of what SPC currently offers, especially in the area of certifications; help provide a conduit between students and workforce to showcase certification opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population includes: jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, college students, and underemployed persons. This project will serve greater than 800 individuals throughout its existence.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project goal is to increase the number of students in the north Pinellas, south Pasco, and northeast Hillsborough County area interested in high wage skilled jobs. SPC will measure the number of students in industry certifications in the areas of computer/technology, health, construction, and manufacturing. SPC will work with community partners already established and those who have immediate positions in the industries related to computer/technology, health, construction, and manufacturing. Successful metrics and outcomes of partnership pipelines will be measured on the number of specific job openings that are filled with SPC graduates. SPC's proven community and track record will allow graduates the ability to not only possess the certification but the ability to gain access to other higher education programs.
