4. **Project/Program Description**

The Youth Council was established to serve the City of Lauderdale Lakes in a number of ways, including keeping the Mayor and Commission abreast of the issues that affect the city's youth; assisting with the planning of social, educational, cultural, and recreational activities for youth; and working with the Mayor, City Commission, and city staff on providing service and leadership opportunities for the youth of the city.
