1.	Program Performance
a.	What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?
	The goal of this project is to construct a road that provides a direct and easily accessible route to the new 120-bed, Advent Health Hospital for all that require medical services, especially emergency services. The new road will connect the existing east and west portions of Harmon Road resulting in an additional east-west roadway connection from CR 437/Binion Road to Marden Road. The roundabout portion of the project will provide safety for drivers at a heavily traveled intersection.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	The construction of Harmon Road and the Harmon Road - CR 437A/Ocoee-Apopka Road intersection roundabout will provide direct access from SR 414 to the new Advent Health Hospital Apopka campus located at the intersection of the existing Harmon Road, and CR 437A/Ocoee-Apopka Road.
C.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Direct and easy to locate access to the Advent Health Hospital Apopka campus for those who need both emergency and non-emergency care, and the City of Apopka Firehouse 6 will be able to respond faster to emergency incidents due to direct access to SI 414 (a limited access highway) via Harmon Road and to transport accident victims to the hospital faster to receive emergency care. Additionally, Harmon Road will provide much needed east-west access in one of the city's fastest growing areas.
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	The target population is all citizens, visitors, and businesses in the area.
e.	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	(1) New roadway segment. Methodology: A connected roadway network that fills a critical gap in the existing Harmon Road. (2) Increased development and tax base for the City of Apopka. Methodology: Number of new residents moving to the area, number of new homes and businesses in the area. (3) Better response times for fire and emergency rescue response. Methodology: emergency rescue to respond to emergencies and subsequent reduced transport time to the Advent Health Hospital Apopka campus.
f.	What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
	Standard contract penalties are sufficient to protect the state's and city's investment in the project.
