11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Youth who demonstrate criminal risk factors (family instability and conflict, school instability or failure, physical or mental health problems, attitude/behavior problems, victimization history) will be diverted from initial contact and further involvement with the Department of Juvenile Justice.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Prevention programming at Manatee and Duval will be provided during the school day and will include education. The program at Gadsden will be an after school program that includes vocational training.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Primary prevention and intervention services include gender-specific life management skills training that addresses trauma and fosters positive gender identity development; individual transition plans and transition services; career exploration, career planning, and development of school to work employability skills; community and service learning opportunities; and youth development activities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Persons with poor mental health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, grade school students, and high school students.

Approximately 200 students will be served by these funds.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

1. Improve quality of education - To assess individual youth functioning, all AMIkids prevention program students will receive the Community Assessment Tool (CAT) assessment. 2. Reduce recidivism - Youth will be tracked throughout to determine whether they have committed a law offense during services (referred to as an Offense During Services [ODS]). All youth will be tracked to determine whether they are adjudicated for any law offense within 12-months of program release. AMI will use the DJJ Juvenile Justice Information System (JJIS) to track offenses during and after services. 3. Divert from criminal/juvenile justice system - Youth assigned will be tracked throughout the evaluation to determine whether they have committed a law offense during services. All youth will be tracked to determine whether they are adjudicated for any law offense within 12-months of program release. AMI will use the DJJ Juvenile Justice Information System.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

AMIkids may be subject to corrective action plan or financial consequences for not meeting specified outcomes/performance measures
