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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funding will provide access to workforce training in high-demand areas for immediate employment in the region and increase the competitiveness of early career technicians seeking progressive development for employment. The local business community will benefit from an increase in the local talent pool of equipment operators working on construction projects in the region.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The program would provide classroom and hands-on vocational training to participants. It would utilize existing facilities, equipment, and employees to train and/or facilitate training on equipment in a way that does not impact the operation of regular municipal services.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Participants will be provided training to learn how to operate machinery, including but not limited to: hydraulic excavators, backhoes, bulldozers, wheel loaders, road/motor graders, forklifts, and hydraulic truck cranes over the course of the program.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes jobless persons, economically disadvantages persons, at-risk youth, and currently or formerly incarcerated persons. Approximately 25-50 individuals are expected to be served by the project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project is expected to create specific immediate job opportunities by providing advancement in technical specialty in a high demand job market. This can be measured through the City of Tallahassee's Technical Position Plan framework. Furthermore, the project is expected to enhance specific individuals' economic self-sufficiency. This can be measured through changes in indicators to trade/income brackets from the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
