a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To provide assistance to Florida's small and minority businesses on a local/statewide level including establishing business resource connections, disseminating business development opportunities, establishing contact, and additional services. Seminars/Workshops/Events – Participate in or offer seminars/workshops and when appropriate integrate Florida's industry promotion strategies. Technical support – Provide technical support, licensing, permitting, and counseling on financial matters, small business development strategies, and trade opportunities to small and minority Florida companies (non-duplication of businesses per calendar year). Establishment of overseas and domestic business connections – These activities will be conducted as part of program outreach efforts to provide business services and connections to companies. Maintain the incubator center with focus on the international trade sector, Florida target industries, and the creative industries.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Technical and business assistance and overseas and domestic business connections. These activities will be conducted as part of a program of outreach efforts to provide the minority business community with access to international and domestic markets.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Monthly seminars, workshops, technical support assistance, incubator (start-up) center for business development, and hosting of the 41st Hemispheric Congress of Latin Chambers of Commerce and Industries.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida's small and minority business community. Over 200 individuals with direct services, and 500 with access to the Hemispheric Congress and other international business events.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

A work program is developed with the Department of Economic Opportunity where quarterly deliverables are outlined and measured.
