11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Construction of state-of-the-art, purpose-built business incubator facility to house and assist start-up companies and create jobs for Tampa Bay residents.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Support programs and services such as business mentoring/coaching, education, idea validation, strategy development, marketing assistance, network opportunities, workforce development, access to capital, access to b-schools and interns, and standard office resources.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Small business owners and entrepreneurs will receive direct services. Some of these will be unemployed individuals. Construction firm and incubator tenants will be encouraged to hire individuals from adjacent economically disadvantaged area. Nearby USF students will conduct market studies and serve as interns. Over the life of the facility many hundreds of individuals will benefit.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Entrepreneurs, small business owners, college students, jobless persons, and economically disadvantaged persons throughout Tampa Bay and those who relocated to the area. During the first four years of operations over 800 individuals will be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

According to a commissioned feasibility study by Greenwood Consulting Group, the incubator can reasonably be expected to create 670 jobs and generate over \$100 million of client revenues within the first four years of operations. Measurement will be by ES-202 reports and client reporting and affidavits.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Standard penalties, including repayment of funds if facility is not built.
