So, in addition to recruiting top talent from abroad and bringing them to the region, the program will also be working to develop the startups that are already here in Florida. The program will shape the future by leading the way for more diverse business ownership throughout the region and supporting diverse entrepreneurship. In addition, it will increase employment throughout the region and the state.
