Contractor services include the use of CCTV (i.e. video) inspections, condition reports, pipe lining, point repairs, ROW restoration, installation of stabilizing "geotubes" along deteriorated earthen embankments, dredging of the canals, and/or other applicable methods necessary to preserve drainage basin areas and canal systems.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Reduced flooding events by increasing system conveyance under normal rainfall conditions and to improve system resiliency against sea level rise.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The City of Margate residents and businesses. Approximately 30,000.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected to reduce the incidence of flooding by increasing system conveyance under normal rainfall conditions and to improve system resiliency against sea level rise.
