The City of Winter Park is dedicated to continual training of public safety employees including firefighters and police officers. Through strategic planning the City of Winter Park and Fire Department has identified unmet needs and find it necessary to operate its own fire training facility. In the greater central Florida area more than five area fire departments share use of an aging and obsolete training site that does not currently meet the needs of Winter Park public safety departments. In order to maintain a level of training for its first responders the city is planning the construction of a purpose built fire training building on city owned property. This facility will be capable of conducting live fire training safely and in compliance with National Fire Protection Association Standard 1402, Standard on Facilities for Fire Service Training.

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Continuing training of public safety employees consistent with established standards and safety practices. Establishes dedicated purpose built equipment and live fire training equipment for required annual training of firefighters.
