14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The FDI is an educational non-profit designed to meet the following goals: increasing civic literacy; expanding speech and debate classroom courses, competitive teams, and infrastructure to grow our national speech and debate civics competition to enhance critical thinking, persuasive speaking/writing and communication skills in over 243 schools in 54 participating Florida school districts this school year; scaling to all counties with emphasis on reaching elementary aged students, all with the cooperation and assistance of the FDOE.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The FDI serves as the educational support organization tasked with educating and training coaches and students, training judges, and establishing competition standards for existing organizations to partner with to provide ample educational competition opportunities. Educational services will be provided to over 240 schools in more than 40 counties this school year.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services include establishing civics/debate education and training programs for coaches and students and creating regional leagues for speech and debate competition opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Middle and high school students across the state, scaling to elementary aged students this school year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Presently, the geographic location of a student often dictates their ability to compete in speech and debate. This funding wil help to equalize those opportunities statewide to provide access to speech and debate in all counties over time. Also, speech and debate provides confidence for students to be their own advocate and to have the critical thinking and communication skills to defend their views. Speech and debate provides the opportunity for students to be exposed to a variety of viewpoints, cultures, backgrounds and experiences and to engage in thoughtful and civil discourse with others. Speech and debate is an educational equalizer for students providing them the ability to learn beyond what classroom education alone can provide. Students will be able to critically analyze information and understand civics in a more meaningful way. The assessment process by which outcomes will be measured will be established by the FDOE.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

While we cannot foresee an applicable scenario under this question arising, if some unforeseeable event occurred where the deliverables/performance measures were not being met, the FDOE would have the discretion to restrict access to funding.
