4. Project/Program Description

St. Gerard Campus, Inc. (SGC) is a comprehensive, faith-based, pro-life, safe haven and center of support for pregnant women and mothers ranging in ages 12-20 who have been shunned by family or face challenges in both having and supporting their children. It is composed of a fully accredited Christian High School, licensed maternity home, on site day care facility and a pregnancy resource center.

As the need for our support services, particularly education and safe housing, has grown throughout St. Johns and surrounding counties, we now need to redevelop and expand our facilities, starting with our dormitory.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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SGC will increase its ability to serve women in need of both education and safe housing from 6 to 30, enabling SGC to meet the broader needs in the greater St. Augustine-Jacksonville area.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

High school education culminating in accredited diploma; safe and secure housing; nutritional support; counseling and training in parenting and life skills

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Education leading to a high school diploma from our accredited school, as well as safe housing, mentoring and care from our staff and volunteer house mothers throughout the woman's pregnancy, childbirth, and infancy through graduation. Mothers are further counseled and aided in pursuing further education and training to provide for their families for life. Our graduates typically go on to nursing school, college, vocational training or enlist in the military. We prepare women in difficult situations, often coming from the most dire situations, to thrive for life as mothers and successful members of society.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our target population is pregnant women and young mothers and their babies who need to be loved, supported and cared for through their pregnancy and early years as a mother. There are women in the most difficult circumstances in society, often coming from abuse, poverty, abandonment or drug-laden environments, women who have nowhere else to turn. We provide hope, love and dignity that these young families will build on for life. We are building to serve up to 30 pregnant or new mothers, plus their babies, in any given academic year

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Upon completion of the redevelopment and requisite staffing increases, the expected benefit is to provide for up to 30 resident student mothers and their babies in a given academic year. We will measure the opportunity to serve (the need expressed in the Saint Johns, Duval, Clay and Flagler counties) and record the number of mothers served in relation to the expressed need, capping our residents at 30 mothers, and ensuring all eligible mothers up to the cap are served and housed.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to provide services for all eligible pregnant women and mothers, up to a maximum of 30 at any given time, should result in (1) disqualification from future funding until remediation is illustrated, (2) submission of a plan by SGC to remediate any shortcomings in performance due to staffing or fundraising shortfalls, (3) the opportunity for the state to recommend remediation measures, and (4) retainment of a qualified consultant to non-profit organizations such as SGC to advise toward improved performance.
