#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The funds requested will be used for road and utility project design and right of way acquisition on a 3.4 mile section NW 49th St. from NW 70th Ave (CR 225) to NW 44th Ave. The goal will be to reduce traffic congestion for both I-75 & those entering/exiting the World Equestrian Center.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project will expand some segments from 2 lanes to 4 lanes, build 4 lanes where no road exists, and relocate and interconnect water and sewer utilities at this same time to provide for much-needed septic-to-sewer connections.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will allow Marion County residents and visitors to the county to utilize the SW/NW 80th/70th Avenue/49th Street corridor, instead of an already congested I-75 and interchanges at I-75 and US 27 & SR 40 for travel within the county and to the World Equestrian Center.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Travelers of the SW/NW 80th/70th Avenue/49th Street corridor will be served by the project. Many of the county's 385,000+ residents utilize I-75 for local travel. Additionally, these road improvements will benefit the estimated 80,000 people I-75 moves through the county daily by reducing traffic and congestion caused by local travelers. Further, this project will serve travelers entering and exiting the World Equestrian Center.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will provide relief to traffic and intersection congestion on I-75 in Marion County and those entering and exiting the World Equestrian Center. We will measure traffic congestion, traffic count, and intersection performance at locations impacted by the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Standard contract penalties including liquidated damages and the potential for failure to be awarded future contracts due to poor or lack of performance.
