The project will convert three dry can sanitary lift stations, Nos. 11, 13, and 14, to submersible lift stations. Following flood conditions and heavy rains, staff cannot safely access the pumps, valves, or electrical equipment at the dry can stations for maintenance or repair. This and the current flood damage at these stations threatens the reliability of the City's wastewater transmission system and is also a threat to public health and safety.



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**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**

Design, permitting, and construction of the conversion of three dry can sanitary lift stations, Nos. 11, 13, and 14, to submersible lift stations.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

The upgraded wastewater pump stations improvements will enhance the reliability and reduce the risk of failure and overflows that have the potential to harm the environment. This will also will incidences of odor complaints from neighboring residents and the potential for failure and associated sewage overflow and sanitary hazards. Also, Reduce spills to the ground and the ground water which is a threat to public health as the public water for the City of Riviera Beach Utility Special District's potable water supply wells are located in the shallow and unconfined surficial aquifer. In addition, this will reduce wastewater spills which include pathogenic organisms to the surface waters of the State. Wastewater is also high in nutrients which can reduce dissolved oxygen in surface waters causing fish kills.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

This will serve 6,000 existing customers. However, the spills and pollutants affect 42,000 existing customers.

Reduction of odor and other complaints. Sanitary sewer overflow reports being submitted to the FDEP. Reduction in Notices of Beach Advisories and Beach Closures issued by the FDOH.
