#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Pine Island Academy, a K-8 school of the St. Johns County School District, opened in 2021. The school is located on Pine Island Road, east of US 1. Due to the increased traffic flow with the new school, intersection modifications are needed at US 1 at Pine Island Road. Currently, there is no signalization, turn lanes or other safety measures. Intersection modifications are an urgent need to protect the safety of school buses, students, parents and others traveling on US 1.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Requested construction funding aims to alleviate current and projected traffic congestion at this intersection thereby improving the transportation system Level of Service (LOS) and safety to St. Johns County residents and motoring public.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The intersection improvements will provide for better operation of school buses, parent traffic going to/from the school, and the other community vehicles flowing through this area.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Grade school students and the general population > 1,000

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
- 1) Improved transportation conditions The improvements will decrease congestion, reduce traffic incidents, and total lost time at this intersection along the US 1 corridor with additional capacity for anticipated growth in the area. Outcome can be measured through annual traffic counts and crash data. 2) Increase economic activity - Construction jobs, increase in land value and spending on goods and services measured through wages, land value and number of jobs. 3) Create immediate jobs - It is anticipated that the project will immediately create at least 25 construction-related job opportunities. Job creation is measurable through an audit of the successful contractor's employment records.
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If there is a performance deficiency requiring correction by the County, Agency will notify County. County will provide Agency with a corrective action plan describing how County will address performance deficiencies. If the corrective action plan implementation fails to remedy deficiencies, Agency will retain two point five percent (2.5%) of the total appropriations amount.
