Gun fire detection technology detects gun fire and alerts critical real-time gun fire intelligence. An acoustical listening device detects the sound of gun fire and pin points the exact location of the gun fire through triangulation. In less than sixty seconds, officers are dispatched to the location in an effort to save lives and locate the precise crime scene. This product will increase solvability of criminal cases, curb gun violence, and build community trust with law enforcement.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Gun fire detection technology uses sophisticated acoustic sensors to detect, locate, and alert law enforcement about gun fire incidents in real-time. Gun fire detection software can help reduce gun violence alongside a comprehensive crime response strategy. Information from the program can be used to prevent future crimes by positioning law enforcement when and where crime is likely to occur. By pinpointing the precise location of gun fire incidents and tracking geographic patterns of gun violence, law enforcement resources can be deployed to those "hot spots" more effectively and more proactively.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Instant alerts enable first responders to aid victims, collect evidence, and identify witnesses. The positive impact of improved public safety will be reflected in better social and economic outcomes as well as a better relationship between the police and the community in the long term.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project is the general population (the majority of funds will benefit no specific group). More than 800 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

With the use of gun fire detection technology, the City expects to see a measurable reduction in gun fire, gun-related violent crimes, and homicides. In the long term, the positive impact of improved public safety will be reflected in better social and economic outcomes as well as a better relationship between the police and the community. This outcome will be measured with crime statistics.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

There are no penalties expected. The penalties for non-deliverables or performance would be the withholding of funds.
