14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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To address Florida's nursing shortage, UCF seeks to complete its new College of Nursing Building which will serve to double the number of graduates with various levels of nursing degrees. A shortage of 37,400 nurses is projected by 2035. UCF is the #1 producer of nursing graduates in Florida with 85% staying and working in the state. Completing this building will help to solve Florida's nursing shortage.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of state-of-the-art instructional and laboratory space for nursing education at the undergraduate, graduate and doctoral levels to prepare more nurses and help to provide a solution to the state's nursing current and projected nursing shortage. The 90,000 gross square foot building (60,000 assignable square footage) will be focused on the future, designed to provide flexible instructional space, innovative simulation and skills labs for hands-on learning and Objective Structured Clinical Examinations, and space for Virtual Reality Inter-professional Healthcare Education. More than 70% (71%) of the facility is dedicated to classrooms, teaching and research laboratories, and study facilities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Nursing education at the undergraduate, graduate and doctoral levels in state-of-the-art instructional and laboratory space designed to prepare nurses for the future of healthcare delivery and instruction. UCF's College of Nursing currently serves more than 2,800 undergraduate and graduate students, awarding 800 degrees annually. There are more than 12,500 Knight nurse alumni, of which 88% are employed in Florida, making a difference in the lives of patients throughout the state.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is students who want to pursue a career in nursing or nursing education. UCF's College of Nursing currently serves more than 2,800 undergraduate and graduate students, awarding 800 degrees annually. There are more than 12,500 Knight nurse alumni, of which 88% are employed in Florida, making a difference in the lives of patients throughout the state.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

UCF will substantially increase nursing graduates to address Florida's nursing shortage, and will produce more graduate nurses to help fill the current nursing faculty shortage. Hospitals and other healthcare entities will better be able to serve the state's population in providing healthcare services, the shortage projections will decrease, and there will be an increased number of nursing faculty so that the state colleges and universities can maintain, and expand, their nursing programs to keep up with Florida's growing population.
