a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Construct a new health and wellness family center in Wesley Chapel to help fill gaps in community needs. This facility will be designed to teach kids how to swim and be safe around water; to provide seniors opportunities to improve their overall health, make friends and combat loneliness; to create a path for youth to overcome summer learning loss and develop lifelong experiences during summer camp; to help those battling chronic diseases make gains; to offer youth more activites that can prevent childhood obesity; bring families together; and so much more for the communities to become healthier in spirit, mind, and body.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This facility will provide welcoming, fully accessible environments for people of all abilities/ages; safe, positive environments for more youth/teens to build character/values through afterschool/teen/sports programs; more opportunities for fun/safety in the water; evidence-based programs/initiatives that address chronic disease caused by lifestyle choices; flexible gathering spaces for community to connect; effective/high quality programs/services for first-time exercisers and their families; support for people of all ages in their pursuit of a healthier lifestyle; and more opportunites for families to bond together.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A variety of programs for adults that promote wellness, reduce risk of chronic disease, and assistance for those battling disease to reclaim their health. Opportunities for youth to cultivate values, skills, and relationships that lead to positive behaviors, chracter development, better health and educational achievement. Innovative comunity-based solutions that work to prevent childhood drowning. Specifically, Livestrong at the Y for Cancer Survivors, Parkinsons Management programs, Diabetes Prevention programs, Swim Lessons, Youth Sports, Teen Leadership programs, Summer Day Camp, Before and Afterschool programming, Senior Wellness programs, Food Distribution, Community Volunteer Initiatives, etc.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Children, teens, adults, senior citizens, cancer survivors, chronically ill community members, at-risk youth, infants and toddlers throughout the Wesley Chapel and Pasco County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Initially, the actual construction of the Y facility. Long-term benefits include improving the overall health and well-being of the Wesley Chapel community members as well as helping to close the Learning Achievement Gap in youth, providing programs that teach life-saving skills and help prevent drowning of youth and teens. Participants will be surveyed to determine growth in overall physical wellness, educational enrichment, and safety.

If the new facility in Wesley Chapel is not constructed, the Y would have to return the funding back to the state.
