14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Children ages birth to five in foster care in Sarasota and DeSoto counties will achieve permanency more quickly than those not enrolled in ECC. Data between 2014-2019 shows permanency through reunification occurred approximately 8.5 months quicker than non-ECC children. Fewer children will return to care. (22 ECC; 36 non-ECC). The parent/child relationship will improve as well as child well-being. Parents rated their satisfaction with ECC as high to very high.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Intensive child welfare case management activities, frequent child-parent psychotherapy, frequent (3-4x/week) parent/child visitation, transportation, monthly family team meetings, monthly court appearances

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Case management services, child-parent psychotherapy, therapeutic consultation with foster parents, teacher, other caregivers, child/foster parent transportation, supervised visitation.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Children ages birth to five in foster care. Approximately 25 children/families will be served in the Suncoast Region (Sarasota, Manatee, DeSoto counties).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

All children enrolled will be referred to Early Steps for developmental evaluation if developmental screens indicate a developmental delay (tracked by case manager). Children enrolled in ECC will achieve permanency (reunification, permanent guardianship, adoption) more quickly than those not enrolled in ECC. Fewer children enrolled in ECC will return to care once permanency is achieved (DCF database). Child will resolve incurred trauma and improve emotional skills. Parents will resolve underlying trauma and improve parent/child relationship. Therapist will provide pre/post scores on the parent/child relationship scale and the DECA.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Performance Outcomes are clearly stated in current CBC contract with penalties for failure to meet deliverables or performance measures, up to and including, termination of the contract.
