b. Municipality and County Hillsborough

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose of this project is to address the unprecedented increase in substance use disorders (SUD). Hillsborough County has experienced an increase of overdose deaths when comparing 2021 to 2020 by 13%. EMS overdose responses increased by 19%. In 2021, 29% of fatal overdoses in Hillsborough County were women, with methamphetamine, cocaine, and fentanyl among the fastest growing problems. There is a great need for a residential SUD treatment program within our county and we would like to lead this vital programming and mission with specialized track for Veteran women and mothers with children in foster care.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

With the support from the State of Florida Legislature, Phoenix House Florida will be able to afford the renovation costs of a 20-bed residential rehabilitation facility serving our women Veterans, mothers of children in foster care, and women throughout our community. With this facility, Phoenix House Florida will offer evidence-based and medication-assisted treatment to female patients within Hillsborough County.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services include: medicated-assisted treatment, assessment, therapy, and case management providing access to primary care, dental, and other services.

Other services include: peer support, supportive housing assistance, family involvement and resources within the community addressing social determinants.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes Veteran women, mothers of children in foster care, and women throughout the community with substance use disorders (SUD) and related mental health conditions. These women are usually also in poor physical health, economically disadvantage, at-risk, homeless and/or currently/formerly incarcerated, and victims of domestic violence.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is the improvement of mental health and drug addiction to women Veterans, mothers of children and foster care, and women within the community who need increased access to timely integrated behavioral health and medication-assisted treatment; regain behavioral, physical and emotional health. Additionally upon completion of the program, leave with employment opportunities and supportive housing options that will support and promote her growth in recovery.
