a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will complete the One More Child Sarasota Campus. This campus will have 11 residential homes and 1 children's center. The campus will serve foster children, single mothers and children, hungry children and struggling families. Projected 5 year impact: 1,631 clients served, 270,000 meals provided, and 1,570 volunteers served.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



Repayment of funds

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The facilities will provide safe, secure, and welcoming environment for foster children, single mothers and children, and other at-risk families in the community. These facilities will provide volunteer opportunities for citizens to help foster children, single mothers and children, and at-risk families through mentorships and other volunteer activities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Single mothers will participate in evidence based programs to provide pathways to self-sufficiency and better care for children. Foster families will receive trainings and support through the Children's Center facility. At-risk families will receive evidence based training to become better parents and citizens. Volunteers will pack backpacks with food for food insecure children in local schools.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, victims of crime

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Projected 5 year impact: 1,631 clients served, 270,000 meals provided, and 1,570 volunteers served. This campus will provide 420 training classes for single mothers and provide residential facilities for One More Child's Single Mothers Program. Trainings and meals will be provided to at risk families. One More Child utilizes the Accelerator database management systems to track outcomes for single mothers and at risk families.
