Passive recreation to include walking trails and an observation piers as well as tying two parts of the city together allowing residents walk-ability to one of the City's largest ball fields and recreation facilities.

Storm water relief for the immediate vicinity and passive recreation for all Lynn Haven residents.

All of Lynn Haven's 21,000 residents will benefit from this project through the passive recreation side and the residents that live in the vicinity of the 300-acre watershed will benefit directly from this project by alleviating their flooding issues and eliminating standing water.

One measurable goal will be the nutrient/sediment removal that is being discharged to a water body currently and what it will be after constructing this treatment facility. Showing a reduction of nutrients will be a success for this project. Another measurable goal to show success is the current number of flooded structures in this area presently and the number of structures after this facility is built and having storm water diverted to it.
