To revert and reappropriate \$500,000 approved in the 2023 budget (Line item 378) which, in addition to the 14 Clubhouse programs already supported by DCF, would provide equivalent state support for mental health rehabilitation and supported employment services to residents of four new programs in Manatee, Hillsborough, Polk and Palm Beach Counties. Additional funding (\$50,000) would support a grants administrator for one year so the Coalition can administer the funds.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Mental Health Clubhouse Supported Employment program is an evidence-based service that helps people living with mental illness find jobs in the competitive marketplace leading to independence and a better quality of life. By implementing a robust job training program designed to teach a wide range of skills, Clubhouse members will be equipped with the skills needed to acquire employment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Clubhouse members of each of the four new programs will be provided with hands-on skills training in areas such as technology, arts & graphics, videography, culinary & hospitality, customer service, and more to match to employer needs. Local businesses will be educated and recruited to provide employment to program-trained members. The FCC will have capacity to administer these grants for one year.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Adults with severe and persistent mental illness in Manatee, Hillsborough, Polk and Palm Beach Counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Each of the 14 existing Mental Health Clubhouses in Florida receives approximately \$125,000-\$150,000 per year from DCF. This request would ensure that the four new Clubhouse programs in Manatee, Hillsborough, Polk and Palm Beach counties receive the same level of state support to help their members secure and sustain employment in the competitive marketplace. Independent studies have found that one year of holistic recovery services are delivered to Clubhouse members for the same cost as a 2-week stay at a psychiatric hospital. Clubhouse members experience a significant decrease in hospitalizations, reduced incarcerations & reduced criminal justice system involvement. Clubhouses are active participants in the recovery-oriented system of care, a core DCF strategy. The Clubhouse model is also a SAMHSA-recognized best practice.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Disbursed funds for deliverables not met will be returned to the state.
