Health insurance coverage for autism 22 spectrum disorder.--23 (1)(a) As used in this section, the term "autism spectrum disorder" is a neurobiological condition that 24 25 includes autism, Asperger syndrome, and Rett's syndrome. 26 (b) Any health insurer or health maintenance 27 organization that issues major medical expense coverage in 28 this state may not exclude coverage prescribed by the

therapeutic evaluations and interventions, such as speech

disorder, including, but not limited to, coverage for

therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, intensive early intervention, applied behavioral analysis, and Lovaas behavioral therapy. (2) Coverage for autism spectrum disorder is subject to the same terms and conditions that the insurer or health maintenance organization applies to the treatment of other disorders. However, an insurer or health maintenance organization may confirm a diagnosis or review the appropriateness of a specific treatment plan in order to ensure that coverage under this section is limited to diagnostic and treatment services. (3) This section does not affect the scope of licensure of any health care professional and does not impair any right to reimbursement which is otherwise guaranteed to a health care provider. Section 2. The Legislature finds that the provisions of this act fulfill an important state interest. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.
