    Organizations must demonstrate the educational components of

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- annually appoint a review panel to assist in the grant-review process. Review panel members shall be appointed to serve for 1-year terms. The panel shall review grant applications and make recommendations to the commissioner concerning the relative merits of the applicants. The department shall by rule establish criteria for reviewing grant applications to ensure compliance with applicable federal and state laws relating to discrimination and conflicts of interest.
- (c) The review panel shall provide a forum for public comment before voting on any grant application.
- (2) The commissioner shall annually include in the department's legislative budget request a recommendation for funding off-site learning grants. The recommendation must include the panel's ranking of applicants and recommended funding levels for each grant.
- (3)(a) Upon appropriation by the Legislature of funding for these grants, the department shall execute a contract with each organization which must contain information relating to the program, the projected operating income and expenses, and other provisions considered necessary by the department for the administration of the program.
- (b) Each recipient organization must submit an annual report to the department detailing the expenditure of the funds and is subject to the auditing provisions and rules of the department.
- (c) Each organization shall have an annual postaudit or independent attestation of its financial accounts as specified in s. 216.349 conducted by an independent certified public accountant. The annual audit report must be submitted to the department for review. The department may require and

receive from the recipient institution or from its independent auditor any detail or supplemental data relating to the operation of the institution. (d) The department shall adopt rules necessary to administer this section. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. SENATE SUMMARY Requires the Commissioner of Education to request funding for off-site learning grants. Establishes a review panel to assist in the grant-making process. Provides requirements for the nonprofit and community-based organization grant recipients.
