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Section 1. Section 465.014, Florida Statutes, is 2 amended to read: 3 465.014 Pharmacy technician. --(1) A No person other than a licensed pharmacist or 4 5 pharmacy intern may not engage in the practice of the profession of pharmacy, except that a licensed pharmacist may delegate to nonlicensed pharmacy technicians registered 8 pursuant to this section those duties, tasks, and functions which do not fall within the purview of s. 465.003(13). All 9 such delegated acts shall be performed under the direct 10 supervision of a licensed pharmacist who shall be responsible 11 12 for all such acts performed by persons under his or her 13 supervision. A registered pharmacy technician, under the supervision of a pharmacist, may initiate or receive 14 communications with a practitioner or his or her agent, on 15 behalf of a patient, regarding refill authorization requests. 16 A No licensed pharmacist may not shall supervise more than one 18 registered pharmacy technician unless otherwise permitted by the guidelines adopted by the board. 465.0196 Special pharmacy permits. -- Any person desiring a permit to operate a special pharmacy shall apply to the department for a special pharmacy permit. If the board certifies that the application complies with the applicable laws and rules of the board governing the practice of the profession of pharmacy, the department shall issue the permit. No permit shall be issued unless a licensed pharmacist is designated to undertake the professional supervision of the compounding and dispensing of all drugs dispensed by the pharmacy. The licensed pharmacist shall be responsible for maintaining all drug records and for providing for the security of the area in the facility in which the compounding, storing, and dispensing of medicinal drugs occurs. 2	COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR <u>Senate Bill 2100</u>
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4	The committee substitute revises the number of pharmacy
5	technicians who may be supervised by a licensed pharmacist to allow a pharmacist to supervise up to four pharmacy technicians under board-approved guidelines. The committee
6	substitute revises requirements for pharmacy technicians to register with the Board of Pharmacy to no longer require such
7	applicants to submit fingerprints and undergo background screening.
8	The committee substitute requires the Board of Pharmacy to
9	adopt rules to require and specify the manner in which a pharmacy must notify the board when a registered technician is
10 11	employed or ceases employment and requires the Board of Pharmacy to maintain a current directory of registered pharmacy technicians which must be published on the Internet.
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
