13	(4) MASTERY OF SUBJECT AREA KNOWLEDGEAcceptable means of
14	demonstrating mastery of subject area knowledge are:
15	(a) Achievement of passing scores on subject area
16	examinations required by state board rule, which may include, but
17	need not be limited to, world languages in Arabic, Chinese,
18	Farsi, French, German, Greek, Haitian Creole, Hebrew, Hindi,
19	Italian, Japanese, Portuguese, Russian, and Spanish;
20	(b) Completion of a bachelor's degree or higher and
21	verification of the attainment of an oral proficiency interview
22	score above the intermediate level and a written proficiency
23	score above the intermediate level on a test administered by the
24	American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages for which
25	there is no Florida-developed examination;
26	<u>(c)</u> Completion of the subject area specialization
27	requirements specified in state board rule and verification of
28	the attainment of the essential subject matter competencies by

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30	district or chief administrative officer of the employing state-
31	supported or private school for a subject area for which a
32	subject area examination has not been developed and required by

34	(d) (c) Completion of the subject area specialization
35	requirements specified in state board rule for a subject coverage
36	requiring a master's or higher degree and achievement of a
37	passing score on the subject area examination specified in state
38	board rule;
39	<u>(e)</u> A valid professional standard teaching certificate
40	issued by another state; or
41	(f) (c) A valid certificate issued by the National Board for
42	Professional Teaching Standards or a national educator
43	credentialing board approved by the State Board of Education.

45	School districts are encouraged to provide mechanisms for those
46	middle school teachers holding only a K-6 teaching certificate to
47	obtain a subject area coverage for middle grades through
48	postsecondary coursework or district add-on certification.
49	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
