A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Space and Aerospace Catalyst and Enhancement Program; creating s. 288.1087, F.S.; providing legislative intent; creating the Space and Aerospace Catalyst and Enhancement Program in the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development; providing that funds be used to upgrade space-related infrastructure or business facilities or to enter into partnerships with applicable businesses on space or aerospace-related projects; requiring that Space Florida and its partners provide certain information in their application to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development; requiring that Space Florida contract with a nationally recognized consultant to develop an economic impact assessment model that evaluates the costs, benefits, useful life, and other relevant factors related to space and aerospace projects; requiring that the model be available to Space Florida by a specified date; providing for the criteria that a project must meet to receive funding; providing for the waiver of such criteria; requiring that the director of the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development recommend approval or disapproval of a proposed project; requiring that the recommendation be sent to the Governor; providing that the Governor consult with the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives before giving final approval; providing that the Legislative Budget Commission review a project that has received

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final approval before releasing the funds; requiring that the director of the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development and the recipient of the funds enter into a contract containing certain conditions; requiring that Space Florida compile and include information relating to each project in its annual report; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 288.1087, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

(1) (a) The Legislature finds that attracting, retaining,

The Legislature also finds that public investment in the space

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overall tax base, invigorate the state's entrepreneurial climate through the resulting business and employment opportunities, and stimulate and enhance the state's universities and community colleges. Further, the Legislature finds that international competition exists for space and aerospace infrastructure, facilities, and business opportunities, and in most instances, when all available resources for economic development have been used, the state encounters competitive disadvantages. The

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Legislature finds that business incentives create a competitive environment for space and aerospace businesses to make it feasible for private investors to provide infrastructure in those areas.

- (b) The Legislature, therefore, declares that sufficient resources shall be made available to respond to extraordinary economic opportunities in the space and aerospace business sectors, to address the need for space and aerospace business facilities and infrastructure, and to compete for key space and aerospace businesses interested in entering into partnerships with the state.
- (2) There is created in the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development the Space and Aerospace Catalyst and Enhancement Program that shall be available to Space Florida.

 The moneys appropriated for the program shall be used to provide or upgrade space-related infrastructure or business facilities and to compete for key space and aerospace-associated businesses interested in entering into partnerships with the state. The moneys shall be distributed to Space Florida once the conditions specified in subsection (5) are met.
- (3) Space Florida and its partners shall submit to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development a joint application detailing their proposed project. The application shall include the following information:
- (a) A description of the type of space and aerospace infrastructure project, its operations, and the product or services associated with the facility.
- (b) The number of full-time equivalent jobs that will be created by the space and aerospace infrastructure project, the

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total estimated average annual wages of those jobs, and the types of business activities and jobs stimulated by the investment.

- (c) The cumulative amount of investment of public and, if applicable, private funds that will be dedicated to the project within a specified period.
- (d) A description of the stimulating effect that the project is expected to have on a particular business sector in the state or regional economy or on the state's universities and community colleges.
- (e) A statement of how the public investment is expected to affect the applicant's decision to locate or expand its business in the state.
- (f) If Space Florida is entering into a public-private partnership with a space-related business entity, a financial analysis of the entity, including an evaluation of the entity's short-term liquidity ratio as measured by its assets to liability, the entity's profitability ratio, the entity's long-term solvency as measured by its debt-to-equity ratio, and the entity's most recent financial audit statement and the related auditor's management letter.
- (4) Space Florida shall enter into a contract with a nationally recognized economic consultant to develop an economic impact assessment model that evaluates the costs, benefits, useful life, and other relevant factors related to space and aerospace projects. The model must be available for use by Space Florida no later than December 31, 2009.
- (5) In order to receive funds through the Space and Aerospace Catalyst and Enhancement Program, a project must:

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117 <u>(a) Assist Space Florida in carrying out its</u> 118 responsibilities under part II of chapter 331;

- (b) Create the potential for or retain existing highquality, high-salary jobs in the space and aerospace industries in the state;
- (c) Have a potential positive payback ratio of at least 5 to 1;
- (d) Be an inducement to the project's location or expansion in the state;
- (e) Be supported by the local community in which the project is located;
- (f) If a public-private partnership, include a match to the state investment; and
 - (g) Have undergone the economic analysis in subsection (4).
- (6) The Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development may waive the criteria specified in subsection (5) based on extraordinary circumstances and if the project would significantly benefit the local or regional economy.
- (7) (a) After receiving the application and the economic impact assessment, the director of the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development, in consultation with Space Florida, shall recommend the approval or disapproval of each proposed project. The recommendation must include performance conditions that the project must meet in order to obtain funding.
- (b) The director's recommendation approving a project shall be sent to the Governor, who shall further evaluate the project.

 The Governor shall consult with the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives before giving a project final approval.

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(c) The Executive Office of the Governor shall present an approved project and the funding request for the project to the Legislative Budget Commission, which shall conduct its review and release the funds pursuant to the legislative consultation and review requirements set forth in s. 216.177.

- (d) After receiving final approval for a project, the director of the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic

 Development and the recipient shall enter into a contract that sets forth the conditions for receiving moneys for the project.

 The contract must include the total amount of funds awarded, the performance conditions that must be met in order to obtain the award, a baseline of current service and a measure of enhanced capability, the methodology for validating performance, the schedule of payments, and sanctions for failure to meet performance conditions. The contract must state that payment is contingent upon sufficient appropriation of funds by the Legislature and upon sufficient release of appropriated funds by the Legislative Budget Commission.
- (8) Space Florida shall compile information about each project that is funded through the Space and Aerospace Catalyst and Enhancement Program and include the information in its annual report.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
