A bill to be entitled

An act relating to student financial assistance; creating s. 1009.893, F.S.; creating the Sure Futures Postgraduate Scholarship Program; providing purposes and goals for the program; creating s. 1009.894, F.S.; providing legislative findings; providing definitions; establishing the Sure Futures Foundation and a foundation board to administer the program; providing for membership of the board; providing duties of the board; providing eligibility criteria for participation in the program by students and sponsors; providing procedures for application to the program; providing procedures for the selection of participants; providing benefits to students selected to participate in the program; providing requirements for such students; requiring that a participating student who graduates with an advanced degree remain employed by his or her sponsor in this state for a specified period; requiring that a prorated portion of the scholarship convert to a low-interest loan under certain conditions; requiring that sponsors and students participating in the program enter into a contract; requiring that such contract contain certain terms; requiring that a sponsor make a specified monetary contribution for scholarships; requiring that a sponsor make a specified additional contribution per year to cover administrative costs of the program; authorizing sponsors to establish terms of sponsorship and specify specific universities at which a student

must enroll in order to receive sponsorship; relieving an employee for his or her obligations under a contract of sponsorship under certain conditions; requiring that the Office of Student Financial Assistance of the Department of Education establish a database containing certain information; requiring that the foundation establish a standard application form; requiring that the Department of Education annually establish the amount necessary to cover certain costs; requiring that state universities make available certain information regarding the program; requiring that certain entities promote participation in the program; requiring that the Department of Education adopt rules; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1009.893, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1009.893 Sure Futures Postgraduate Scholarship Program.-The

Sure Futures Postgraduate Scholarship Program is created for the purpose of establishing a scholarship program to match private-sector businesses that need employees having advanced degrees with students seeking advanced degrees and employment. The goals of the program are to provide for a more highly educated workforce by offering students greater academic and financial access to the pursuit of advanced degrees in areas of critical

need and to recruit and retain the state's best and brightest

graduate students by offering them comprehensive financial assistance for educational pursuits and potential employment with the private-sector businesses that have indicated their willingness to enter into partnerships in the program.

Section 2. Section 1009.894, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1009.894 The Sure Futures Foundation. -

(1) The Legislature finds that there exists in Florida a labor shortage of employees who have received postgraduate degrees in areas identified by the Board of Governors in its 10year strategic plan. The Legislature further finds that there is a critical need for the state to ensure that this state's students have increased access to postgraduate education opportunities in the state; that businesses relocate or remain active in this state, thus contributing to the economic success and viability of this state; and that a qualified and highly educated workforce is available and willing to seek employment with such businesses. Further, public universities in this state can play a vital role in ensuring that students are given incentives to remain in the state education system and seek postgraduate degrees by offering financial incentives and diversity in education programs that contribute to filling the critical needs of private businesses in Florida. The Legislature recognizes that the United States Armed Forces have been extremely successful for many decades in recruiting and retaining exceptional students through scholarships in the reserve officer training corps (ROTC) programs resulting in the requirement of a minimum 4-year service commitment from program graduates who are trained in and assigned to critical career

fields. Lastly, the Legislature desires to establish a workforce-development program in this state which is similar to the proven Armed Forces ROTC programs in an effort to promote, recruit, and retain a qualified workforce to meet the demands of this state and its businesses.

- (2) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Sure Futures scholar" or "scholar" means a student admitted into at least one postgraduate program within the 16 identified areas of critical need identified by the Board of Governors in its most recent 10-year strategic plan.
- (b) "Sure Futures sponsor" or "sponsor" means a corporation, partnership, limited liability company, sole proprietor, or other business entity participating in the Sure Futures Postgraduate Scholarship Program through scholarship endowment contributions and commitments to offering employment and entering into employment contracts with Sure Futures scholars.
- (3) The "Sure Futures Foundation," hereinafter referred to as "foundation," is established and shall seek designation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The foundation shall be governed by the Sure Futures Foundation Board, which shall administer the Sure Futures Postgraduate Scholarship Program with guidance from the Board of Governors and the State Board of Education. Duties of the foundation board include, but are not limited to:
- (a) Adoption of policies and procedures for implementing the program, including approving sponsors and the scholarship criteria of such sponsors.
 - (b) Establishment of a process for approving printed and

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to a 1-year term.

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(c) Establishment of a process and procedure for matching sponsors with scholars at the inception of the scholar's postgraduate program. (d) Establishment and maintenance, when applicable, of the foundation's student loans. (4) The board of the foundation shall be comprised of: (a) The Commissioner of Education, as an ex officio member. (b) The chair of the Board of Governors, as an ex officio member. (c) Four state university presidents selected by the State University Presidents' Association, who shall be appointed to 2year terms. (d) Four sponsors participating in the program, recommended by the Commissioner of Education and selected by the Governor, who shall be appointed to 2-year terms. (e) One graduate student recommended by the Commissioner of Education and selected by the Governor, who shall be appointed

electronic materials, marketing, and advertising.

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The Commissioner of Education, the chair of the Board of Governors, the university presidents, or any of the sponsors may designate a specific individual to represent him or her at foundation board meetings. The foundation board members shall serve without compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for travel and per diem expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with s. 112.061. The Institute of Science and Public Affairs at Florida State University, as created in s. 1004.58 and operating as Florida State University,

shall provide operational management and administrative and support staff to the foundation.

- (5) (a) The following students are eligible as candidates for a Sure Futures Postgraduate Scholarship and thereby eligible to obtain a list of sponsors and the graduate degree programs for which such sponsors are seeking candidates:
- 1. A student in his or her senior year who is an undergraduate student at a state university or a private college or university in the state.
- 2. A student in his or her senior year who is an undergraduate student at an out-of-state college or university but who would otherwise qualify as a resident for purposes of in-state tuition if otherwise attending a state university.
- 3. A graduate of a state university or a private college or university in the state who, within 12 months following graduation, intends to pursue a graduate degree program at a state university.
- (b) A student shall apply, using a standard application form, to the Sure Futures Foundation for designated Sure-Futures-degreed programs at each state university to which the student has been admitted into a postgraduate program. A predetermined limit shall be established by the foundation board for the maximum number of applications a student may submit in a given scholarship cycle.
- (c) After the initial candidate screening and interview phase, a student selected to be offered a Sure Futures

 Postgraduate Scholarship shall be matched by the Sure Futures

 Foundation with a sponsor. The student and the sponsor shall sign a contract whereby the student agrees to borrow scholarship

funds through the program, with a waiver-of-payment provision if a 4-year employment obligation is completed, and the sponsor agrees to provide a defined 4-year employment position in the state. For each year that the student is enrolled full time as a graduate student, the scholarship shall cover tuition, fees, and books for the degree program; health insurance with an option for the scholar to purchase additional coverage through a family plan for dependents; and room and board based on the university dormitory and meal-plan rate.

- (d) A student must maintain a minimum grade point average as determined by the sponsor.
- (e) If a student is unable to take a full load of coursework during a summer semester, the student may be required by the sponsor to participate in an internship program.
- (f) Upon graduation with an advanced degree, a graduate shall begin working for the sponsor and must remain employed in this state by the sponsor for a minimum of 4 years as stipulated in the contract.
- (g) If a student fails to maintain the required grade point average or the graduate terminates his or her employment before completing the 4-year obligation, a prorated portion of the scholarship shall convert to a low-interest loan administered by the Sure Futures Foundation.
- (h) The contract signed by the sponsor and the student must clearly state the terms of the loan, the company's expectations for the scholar's performance, employment requirements, and potential legal remedies if the terms and conditions of the contract are not met. The terms of such contract must include as a condition of the scholar accepting a match with a particular

sponsor noncompetition, nonsolicitation, and nondisclosure provisions as required by the sponsor for up to 4 years following the scholar's completion of the postgraduate degree requirements.

- (6) (a) A sponsor desiring new employees having advanced degrees shall make a monetary contribution to the program in amounts equal to 50 percent of the total scholarship funds necessary for completing an eligible degree program pursuant to this section from which it wishes to draw students, plus an additional 3 percent per year for the degree program for the Sure Future Foundation to cover administrative costs of the Sure Futures Postgraduate Scholarship Program. Contributions shall be made in one lump-sum payment before the student begins postgraduate coursework. Such funds shall be matched by the state under its matching program as provided in s. 1011.94(2) and (3) (b) 5. A sponsor may contribute one or more scholarships, but must offer employment in Florida for each scholar to which the sponsor is matched for the 4-year contracted employment period.
- (b) A sponsor may establish terms of sponsorship, including, but not limited to, the degree sought, minimum grade point average, and requirements regarding extracurricular activities.
- (c) A sponsor may select the state universities at which students may enroll or it may allow its scholarships to be available for study at any state university.
- (d) If a sponsor terminates a scholarship employee for reasons other than malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance before the employee completes the 4-year obligation, the

employee is not required to repay the scholarship. A sponsor is encouraged to establish protocols to retain an employee before his or her termination.

- (7) (a) On behalf of the foundation, the Office of Student Financial Assistance of the Department of Education shall establish a central database of sponsors, the graduate degree programs for which the sponsors are seeking candidates, and student applicants and their profiles. For purposes of this section, the foundation, in consultation with the office, shall establish a standard application for use by all state universities.
- (b) On an annual basis, the Department of Education shall establish the amount necessary to cover the costs for degree programs for which sponsors may make contributions pursuant to this section.
- (8) Prepared documentation and electronic information regarding the program shall be made available through the appropriate office at each state university. As deemed appropriate by its administration, a state university may provide additional information or activities, such as providing one-on-one discussions with advisors, conducting seminars on the program, or working with companies in its service area to create scholarships through the program.
- (9) State agencies, local workforce boards, chambers of commerce, and Enterprise Florida, Inc., are strongly encouraged to promote participation in the program by sponsors and students.
- (10) The Department of Education shall adopt rules to administer this section, including rules establishing

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Section 3. There is appropriated in the form of a non-interest loan from nonrecurring general revenue a sum not to exceed \$300,000 to the Sure Futures Foundation to pay for costs associated with establishing and administering the foundation and the Sure Futures Postgraduate Scholarship Program. Such appropriation shall be repaid by the foundation on or before December 31, 2011.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
