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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to military base closures; creating s. 288.984, F.S.; establishing the Legislative Oversight Council on United States Department of Defense Base Realignment and Closure Activities; providing the council's mission; providing for membership; providing for terms of appointment; providing for reappointment of members; providing for election of a council chair and vice chair; providing for members to be reimbursed for expenses; providing for council committees and the tasks of the committees; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 288.984, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

288.984 Legislative Oversight Council on United States

Department of Defense Base Realignment and Closure Activities.—

The Legislative Oversight Council on United States Department of

Defense Base Realignment and Closure Activities is established.

The council shall provide oversight of the initiatives and actions taken on behalf of the state under this part.

- (1) MISSION.-The mission of the council is to:
- (a) Keep the state's military installations and their core missions off the Department of Defense's base realignment and closure activities list.
- (b) Know the capabilities of state military installations in order to accommodate the realignment of bases from other locations and the potentiality for realigning bases from this

(c) Support local community efforts relating to the realignment and closure of a military base by acting as a liaison between the local communities and the Legislature.

(2) MEMBERSHIP.-

- (a) The council shall be composed of six members. The President of the Senate shall appoint three members, at least two of whom shall be members of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint three members, at least two of whom shall be members of the House of Representatives.
- (b) Each of the legislative members appointed by the presiding officer of each house of the Legislature shall be appointed to a term of 2 years, commencing July 1 of each odd-numbered year. The offices of the legislative members become vacant if the legislators cease to be members of the house of the Legislature from which they were appointed. Each of the other members shall be appointed to a term of 4 years, commencing July 1 in the year of appointment. A vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the initial appointment. All members of the council are eligible for reappointment.
- (c) Members of the council shall elect a chair and vice chair to terms of 2 years and the chair and vice chair are eligible to succeed themselves.
- (d) The members of the council shall serve without compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement from the appointing legislative chamber for expenses in accordance with s. 112.061.

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(3) SUBCOMMITTEES.—The council shall establish the following committees:

- (a) The Intrastate Activities Committee. The task of the committee is to:
- 1. Collect information about and become familiar with the concerns and activities of local communities in protecting their respective military bases.
- 2. Conduct an analysis of the probability of base realignment and closure actions for each military base and share that evaluation with the affected community and the council.
- 3. Obtain the latest base realignment and closure information available from the Federal Government and ensure that communities are updated on that information.
- 4. Collect effective methods and practices used by local communities to address the issue of base realignment or closure and disseminate such best practices among affected communities.
- 5. Ensure that no affected community or stakeholder is left out of state-level efforts and that everyone sees the value in a statewide coordination of information gathering, strategy development, and best-practice sharing.
- 6. Educate the Legislature on the importance of supporting legislation relating to the state's military bases.
- (b) The Federal Activities Committee. The task of the committee is to ensure that the council has a presence at the Pentagon and to have on-going dialogue with key Department of Defense officials concerning the state's military bases.
- (c) The Competitive Advantages Committee. The task of the committee is to research and collect best practices and strategies throughout the country with respect to other military
