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29 penalty which requires reimbursement to the department of 30 tuition charges and student fees under specified circumstances; amending s. 1009.21, F.S.; revising a 31 provision relating to the classification of members of the 32 33 Florida National Guard as residents for tuition purposes 34 to conform to changes made by the act; amending s. 35 1009.26, F.S.; eliminating a reference to educational fee waivers for certain members of the Florida National Guard; 36 37 providing an effective date. 38 39 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 40 Subsections (7), (8), and (9) of section 41 Section 1. 42 250.10, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 250.10 Appointment and duties of the Adjutant General .--43 44 (7)The Adjutant General, the Board of Governors of the 45 State University System, and the State Board of Education shall 46 develop an education assistance program programs for members in 47 good standing of the active Florida National Guard who enroll in a public or nonpublic institution of higher learning in the 48 49 state which has been accredited by the Commission on Colleges of 50 the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools or a 51 vocational-technical program in the state which has been 52 accredited by the Council on Occupational Education. This 53 program shall be known as the Educational Dollars for Duty 54 program (EDD). 55 The program programs shall set forth application (a) 56 requirements, including, but not limited to, requirements that Page 2 of 9

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57 the applicant:

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1. Be 17 years of age or older.

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2. Be presently domiciled in the state.

3. Be <u>an active drilling</u> a member <u>and</u> in good standing in the active Florida National Guard at the beginning of and throughout the entire academic term for which benefits are received.

Maintain continuous satisfactory participation in the
 active Florida National Guard for any school term for which
 exemption benefits are received.

5. Upon enrollment in <u>the</u> a program specified in subsection (8) or subsection (9), complete a memorandum of agreement to comply with the rules of the program and serve in the <u>active</u> Florida National Guard for <u>the period specified in</u> <u>the member's enlistment or reenlistment contract</u> 3 years after completion of the studies for which an exemption is granted or tuition and fees are paid.

(b) The program programs shall define those members of the active Florida National Guard who are ineligible to participate in the program and those courses of study which are not authorized for the program.

a. any member, commissioned officer, warrant officer, or
enlisted person who has <u>obtained a master's degree using the</u>
<u>program</u> a baccalaureate degree.

92 The Adjutant General, together with the Board of (C) 93 Governors of the State University System and the State Board of 94 Education, shall adopt rules for the overall policy, guidance, 95 administration, implementation, and proper use utilization of 96 the program. Such rules must include, but not be limited to, guidelines for certification by the Adjutant General of a guard 97 98 member's eligibility, procedures for notification to an 99 institution of a guard member's termination of eligibility, and 100 procedures for restitution when a guard member fails to comply 101 with the penalties described in this section.

102 (8) The Department of Military Affairs may administer a 103 tuition exemption program, known as the State Tuition Exemption 104 Program (STEP), for members of the Florida National Guard who 105 qualify pursuant to subsection (7).

106 (a) Members of the Florida National Guard are exempt from 107 payment of one-half of tuition and fees, subject to the 108 following limitations:

109 1. A member may not participate in the STEP Program for 110 more than 10 years following the date of enrollment in the 111 tuition assistance program. 112 2. Florida National Guard members shall be admitted on a

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space-available basis. 113 114 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) and subject to 115 appropriations, the Department of Military Affairs may pay one-116 half the cost of tuition and fees for required courses for 117 members of the Florida National Guard if a member is unable to 118 least obtain admittance on a space-available basis and, at 119 one previous occasion, the member was denied admission to the 120 required course. 121 (c) Courses not authorized include noncredit courses, 122 courses that do not meet degree requirements, or courses that do 123 not meet requirements for completing career training. 124 Penalties for noncompliance with program requirements (d) 125 include, but are not limited to: 126 1. If a member of the active Florida National Guard 127 receives an exemption from tuition and fees for any academic 128 term and fails to maintain satisfactory participation in the 129 Florida National Guard during that academic term, the member 130 forfeits his or her exemption and shall pay the institution 131 granting the exemption all tuition charges and student fees for the academic term for which the exemption was granted. 132 133 2 If a member of the active Florida National Guard leaves 134 the Florida National Guard during the 3-year period the member 135 has agreed to serve after completing the courses for which an 136 exemption was granted, the member shall reimburse the 137 institution granting the exemption for all tuition charges and 138 student fees for which the member received an exemption, unless 139 the Adjutant General finds that there are justifiable 140 extenuating circumstances.

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141 3. If the service of a member of the active Florida
142 National Guard is terminated or the member is placed on
143 scholastic probation while receiving an exemption, the exemption
144 shall be immediately forfeited and the member shall pay the
145 institution granting the exemption all tuition charges and
146 student fees for the academic term for which the exemption was
147 granted.

148 4. If a member defaults on any repayment made under this 149 paragraph, the institution may charge the member the maximum 150 interest rate authorized by law.

151 (8) (9) Subject to appropriations, the Department of 152 Military Affairs may pay the full cost of tuition and fees for 153 required courses for current members of the Florida National Guard who enlist after June 30, 1997. Members are eligible to 154 155 use the program upon enlistment in the Florida National Guard. 156 If a member is enrolled in a nonpublic postsecondary education 157 institution or a nonpublic vocational-technical program, the 158 Department of Military Affairs shall pay an amount equal to the 159 amount that would be required to pay for the average tuition and 160 fees at a public postsecondary education institution or public 161 vocational-technical program. This program shall be known as the 162 Educational Dollars for Duty program (EDD) and is the primary 163 program for these members. 164 A member may participate in the program if he or she (a)

165 <u>maintains satisfactory participation in, and is an active</u> 166 <u>drilling member of, the Florida National Guard. Inactive members</u> 167 <u>of the Florida National Guard and members of the Individual</u> 168 <u>Ready Reserve (IRR) are not eligible to participate in the</u>

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169 program. A member may not participate in the EDD program for 170 more than 5 years following the date of eligibility for the 171 program.

(b) Courses not authorized include noncredit courses,
 courses that do not meet the degree requirements, or courses
 that do not meet requirements for completing career training.

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(c) College preparatory classes are authorized courses.(b) (d) Penalties for noncompliance with program

176 <u>(b) (d)</u> Penalties for noncompliance with program 177 requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:

178 1. If a member of the active Florida National Guard 179 receives payment of tuition and fees for any academic term and 180 fails to maintain satisfactory participation in the Florida 181 National Guard during that academic term, the member shall 182 reimburse the Department of Military Affairs all tuition charges 183 and student fees for the academic term for which the member 184 received payment.

185 2. If a member of the active Florida National Guard leaves 186 the Florida National Guard during the 3-year period specified in 187 the member's enlistment or reenlistment contract the member has 188 agreed to serve after completing the courses for which payments 189 were made, the member shall reimburse the Department of Military 190 Affairs all tuition charges and student fees for which the 191 member received payments, unless the Adjutant General finds that 192 there are justifiable extenuating circumstances. This 193 subparagraph shall be given retroactive effect and shall apply 194 to members who left the Florida National Guard prior to July 1, 195 2009. Nothing in this subparagraph shall be construed to relieve 196 a member of the Florida National Guard of any obligation to

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197 reimburse the Department of Military Affairs for any tuition 198 charges and student fees owed to the department under this 199 section, regardless of whether the obligation was incurred 200 before, on, or after July 1, 2009.

3. If the service of a member of the active Florida National Guard is terminated or the member is placed on scholastic probation while receiving payments, the member shall reimburse the Department of Military Affairs all tuition charges and student fees for the academic term for which the member received payment.

4. If a member defaults on any reimbursement made under
this paragraph, the department may charge the member the maximum
interest rate authorized by law.

210 Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (10) of section 211 1009.21, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

212 1009.21 Determination of resident status for tuition 213 purposes.--Students shall be classified as residents or 214 nonresidents for the purpose of assessing tuition in community 215 colleges and state universities.

(10) The following persons shall be classified as residents for tuition purposes:

(a) Active duty members of the Armed Services of the
United States residing or stationed in this state, their
spouses, and dependent children, and active <u>drilling</u> members of
the Florida National Guard who qualify under s. 250.10(7) and
(8) for the tuition assistance program.
