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and insert:

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Section 2. Section 322.08, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

322.08 Application for license; requirements for license and identification card forms.-

(1) Each application for a driver's license shall be made in a format designated by the department and sworn to or affirmed by the applicant as to the truth of the statements made in the application.



14 (2) Each such application shall include the following 15 information regarding the applicant: 16 (a) Full name (first, middle or maiden, and last), gender, 17 proof of social security card number satisfactory to the 18 department, county of residence, mailing address, proof of residential address satisfactory to the department, country of 19 20 birth, and a brief description. (b) Proof of birth date satisfactory to the department. 21 22 (c) Proof of identity satisfactory to the department. Such 23 proof must include one of the following documents issued to the 24 applicant: 25 1. A driver's license record or identification card record from another jurisdiction that required the applicant to submit 26 27 a document for identification which is substantially similar to 28 a document required under subparagraph 2., subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., subparagraph 6., subparagraph 29 30 7., or subparagraph 8.; 2. A certified copy of a United States birth certificate; 31 32 3. A valid, unexpired United States passport; 33 4. A naturalization certificate issued by the United States 34 Department of Homeland Security; 35 5. A valid, unexpired alien registration receipt card (green card); 36 37 6. A Consular Report of Birth Abroad provided by the United 38 States Department of State; 39 7. An unexpired employment authorization card issued by the 40 United States Department of Homeland Security; or

8. Proof of nonimmigrant classification provided by the
United States Department of Homeland Security, for an original

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43 driver's license. In order to prove nonimmigrant classification, 44 an applicant may produce the following documents, including, but 45 not limited to:

46 a. A notice of hearing from an immigration court scheduling47 a hearing on any proceeding.

48 b. A notice from the Board of Immigration Appeals49 acknowledging pendency of an appeal.

c. A notice of the approval of an application for
adjustment of status issued by the United States Bureau of
Citizenship and Immigration Services.

d. Any official documentation confirming the filing of a
petition for asylum or refugee status or any other relief issued
by the United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration
Services.

e. A notice of action transferring any pending matter from
another jurisdiction to this state issued by the United States
Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services.

f. An order of an immigration judge or immigration officer
granting any relief that authorizes the alien to live and work
in the United States, including, but not limited to, asylum.

g. Evidence that an application is pending for adjustment
of status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent
residence in the United States or conditional permanent resident
status in the United States, if a visa number is available
having a current priority date for processing by the United
States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services.

h. On or after January 1, 2010, an unexpired foreign
passport with an unexpired United States Visa affixed,
accompanied by an approved I-94, documenting the most recent

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72 admittance into the United States.

74 Presentation of any of the documents in subparagraph 7. or 75 subparagraph 8. entitles the applicant to a driver's license or 76 temporary permit for a period not to exceed the expiration date 77 of the document presented or 1 year, whichever occurs first.

(d) Whether the applicant has previously been licensed to drive, and, if so, when and by what state, and whether any such license or driving privilege has ever been disqualified, revoked, or suspended, or whether an application has ever been refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such disqualification, suspension, revocation, or refusal.

84 (e) Each such application may include fingerprints and85 other unique biometric means of identity.

86 (3) Each such application shall include a consent to
87 release driving record information, entitling the department to
88 request, receive, and exchange such information with other
89 jurisdictions.

90 (4) In addition to the requirements of subsections (1), 91 (2), and (3), each application for a commercial driver's license 92 shall include a certification as to whether the applicant is 93 required by federal or state law to undergo biennial physical 94 examinations and other certifications required by the 95 department.

96 (5) The department may not issue a driver's license to a 97 person who has never been issued a driver's license in any 98 jurisdiction until he or she successfully completes the traffic 99 law and substance abuse education course prescribed in s. 100 322.095. 101 (6) The department may not issue a driver's license or 102 identification card, as described in s. 322.051, to an applicant 103 if the applicant holds a valid driver's license or 104 identification card issued by any state.

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
