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Section 35. In order to implement Specific Appropriation 2535AI, section 288.984, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

288.984 Florida Council on Military Base and Mission
Support.-The Florida Council on Military Base and Mission
Support is established. The council shall provide oversight and
direction for initiatives, claims, and actions taken on behalf
of the state, its agencies, and political subdivisions under
this part.

(1) MISSION.-The mission of the council is to:

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14	(a) Support and strengthen all United States Department of
15	Defense missions and bases located in this state.
16	(b) Know the capabilities of all state military
17	installations in order to understand and be supportive of future
18	military growth opportunities in this state.
19	(c) Support local community efforts relating to mission
20	support of a military base by acting as a liaison between the
21	local communities and the Legislature.
22	(d) Enhance Florida's defense economy.
23	(e) Make recommendations that prepare the state for
24	effectively competing in any federal base realignment and
25	closure action.
26	(f) Improve the state's military-friendly environment for
27	service members, military dependents, and military retirees and
28	for businesses that bring military- and base-related jobs to the
29	state.
30	(2) MEMBERSHIP
31	(a) The council shall be composed of <u>13</u> nine members.
32	(a) The President of the Senate and, the Speaker of the
33	House of Representatives , and the Governor shall each appoint
34	three members as follows:
35	1. The President of the Senate shall appoint one member of
36	the Senate, one community representative from a community-based
37	defense support organization, and one member who is a retired
38	military general or flag-rank officer residing in this state or
39	an executive officer of a defense contracting firm doing
40	significant business in this state.
41	2. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
42	appoint one member of the House of Representatives, one

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43 community representative from a community-based defense support organization, and one member who is a retired military general 44 or flag-rank officer residing in this state or an executive 45 46 officer of a defense contracting firm doing significant business 47 in this state. 48 (b) 3. The Governor or his or her designee shall serve as 49 chair of the council, and the Governor shall appoint seven 50 members as follows: 51 1. The director or designee of the Office of Tourism, 52 Trade, and Economic Development.au53 2. The vice chairperson or designee of Enterprise Florida, 54 Inc., and one at-large member. 55 3. Five members at large. 56 (c) (b) Each of the appointed legislative members shall serve for a term of 2 years, commencing July 1 of each odd-57 numbered year. Each of the other appointed members shall serve 58 59 for a term of 4 years, commencing July 1 in the year of appointment. A vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the 60 unexpired term in the same manner as the initial appointment. 61 62 All members of the council are eligible for reappointment. (c) Members of the council shall elect a chair and vice 63 chair to serve for terms of 2 years. The chair and vice chair 64 are eligible to succeed themselves. 65 (d) The members of the council shall serve without 66 67 compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and 68 travel expenses in accordance with s. 112.061, which shall be 69 paid by the appointing legislative chamber or the Executive 70 Office of the Governor, as appropriate. 71 (e) The Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development

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72 shall provide administrative support to the council <u>unless the</u> 73 <u>councils is authorized to have its own support staff</u>.

74 (f) The Secretary of Community Affairs or his or her 75 designee, the Secretary of Environmental Protection or his or 76 her designee, the Secretary of Transportation or his or her 77 designee, the Adjutant General of the state or his or her 78 designee, and the executive director of the Department of 79 Veterans' Affairs or his or her designee shall attend meetings 80 held by the council and provide assistance, information, and 81 support as requested by the council.

82 (3) WORKGROUPS.-The council shall establish the following83 workgroups:

84 (a) The Intrastate Activities Workgroup.-The task of the85 workgroup is to:

86 1. Collect information about and become familiar with the 87 concerns and activities of local communities in enhancing and 88 supporting their respective military bases.

89 2. Conduct an analysis of the strengths of each military 90 base and share the evaluation with the council and the affected 91 community.

92 3. In partnership with the Florida Defense Alliance and 93 local communities, conduct ongoing analyses of current and 94 proposed changes to the mission and military force structure and 95 alignment of the United States Department of Defense.

96 4. Identify the most effective methods and practices used
97 by local communities to address the issue of military base
98 support and enhancement and disseminate such best practices
99 among affected communities.

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5. Ensure that affected communities and stakeholders are

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101 informed of and invited to assist and support state-level 102 efforts to affect statewide coordination of information 103 gathering, strategy development, and the sharing of best 104 practices.

105 6. Educate the Legislature on the importance of supporting106 legislation relating to the state's military bases.

(b) The Federal Activities Workgroup.-The task of the workgroup is to ensure that the council has a presence at the Pentagon and has ongoing dialogue with key Department of Defense officials concerning the state's military bases.

(c) The Competitive Advantages Workgroup.—The task of the workgroup is to research and identify best practices and strategies throughout the country with respect to other military communities in order to leverage the state's competitive advantage.

(d) The Public Communications Workgroup.—The task of the workgroup is to increase public awareness of the presence and value of United States military installations and their missions in Florida and public investment in supporting the state's military bases.

(4) ANNUAL REPORT.—The council shall prepare and submit a report to the Legislature and the Governor by January 1 of each year. The report shall summarize the current status of the state's military bases, the council's activities, and any recommendations for legislative or executive action.

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(5) EXPIRATION.-This section expires July 1, 2012.
