33 antidiscriminatory profiling policy into the agency's policies
34 and practices, utilizing the Florida Police Chiefs Association
35 Model Policy as a guide. Antiprofiling policies shall include
36 the elements of definitions, traffic stop procedures, community
37 education and awareness efforts, and policies for the handling
38 of complaints from the public.

39 (2) On or before July 1, 2012, every municipal law
40 enforcement agency shall incorporate a policy into the agency's
41 policies and practices concerning implementation of the relevant
42 provisions of chapter 820 in a manner consistent with federal
